CAMP CABINS AT METHODIST SITE GOING UP

Section to Be Finished for Use Beginning July 1

Seventeen campers' cabins are nearing completion, with a dining hall and kitchen in the process of construction, at the 39-acre site on the government reservation at Caney lake for the Methodist Shreveport-Ruston summer camp for its youths.

To date \$30,000 over and above the contribution of materials and facilities has been spent. About the same amount will be needed to complete the present units, which have been started. A section of the project will be completed for summer camps to be conducted from July, running through August.

The master plan for the camp provides for 23 sleeping cabins, dining hall and kitchen to care for 150, a recreational lodge, staff lodge, health lodge, caretaker's lodge, swimming pier, vesper pier, amphitheatre, and office. Plus the buildings already started, the water and sewage systems and water well are near completion.

Architectural plans for all build-

ings were drawn by the firm of Peyton and Bosworth of Shreveport. Engineering plans were made by Lambert Landscape company.

Other contributions to the project were made by Gifford-Hill, Braswell and Van Pean gravel companies, all of Minden, who donated sand and gravel; United States government, piling; law firm of Campbell and Campbell of Minden, drew up charter; Lincoln Creosoting company of Shreveport, creosoted piling; Holliday Well company of Jonesboro, water well; L. B. Kilpatrick of Shreveport, concrete blocks, and Atkins studios of Minden, photography.

The building committee, headed by G. W. Pomeroy, is composed of Joe Greer, Davidson Brown and Don Hinton, who is construction superintendent.

The camping corporation officers are G. W. Pomeroy, president; Glen L. Shadow of Ruston, first vice president; R. P. Lay of Gilliam, second vice president; R. L. Taylor of Arcadia, treasurer, and Mrs. Glen E. Laskey, secretary.
