Caney Lake Camp Opens on Monday

Methodist young people from the Shreveport area will leave Monday for Camp Caney Lake, four miles northwest of Minden. This camp, situated on the government lake, has just been completed and is owned by the Shreveport and Ruston districts of the Methodist church. Approximately \$60,000 has been spent, making this camp one of the best in the country.

The first camp will be under the direction of the Rev. Ted Howes of Mooringsport, and will be open to all Methodist intermediates in the Shreveport district. The camp for older young people will open Monday, July 26, and will be in charge of the Rev. J. C. Sensintaffar of Vivian. The second intermediate camp will be held the week of Aug. 2.

The camp programs will include swimming and other forms of recreation, outdoor vesper services, classes and special projects built around the theme, "Our Hungry World."

The camp can accommodate only 150 campers at a time and there are some vacancies remaining in the enrollment. Methodist young people in this area are urged to enroll in one of these camps.

These camps for the Shreveport district are part of a state-wide summer program promoted by the Methodist church. There will be about 15 camps held over the state this summer reaching approximately
